Dear societies

Congratulations on a great season, there have been some excellent shows and you should all be very proud of your work. This will be recognised at the Awards in September, and while we are still a few adjudications short of being able to contact nominees, it shouldn't be long before I'm in touch with societies to pass on the nominations.

This is an update on a few things before we go quieter during the summer.

LCAG AGM

As you have been made aware previously, the LCAG AGM is being held on 7 September. It is again being held at 7pm – 8pm, so people can attend and still have time for rehearsals afterwards. The nominations form for officers is up in the theatre, and all positions are up for renewal. While the majority of the Exec are intending to stand again, we are still short of a secretary and any Guild member can be nominated for a role on Exec. The deadline for this is 1st September.

I have attached a copy of the complaints procedure that has been drafted and approved by the Exec. As an amendment to the wording of the constitution, we would like to amend paragraph 19, which currently reads:

Verbal Abuse, Bullying, Harassment and Violence are un-acceptable. In the event of any of these being reported, the Leeds Civic Arts Guild complaints procedure as detailed in the Guild Pack will be enacted and a full investigation will take place, and the appropriate action taken once the investigation is concluded.

This needs to be ratified by societies at the AGM.

GUILD AWARDS

As I've already mentioned, the Awards nominations will be out soon, though we are still waiting for a number of trophies to be returned to the theatre. All winning societies from last year have been contacted with a request to get the trophies back to us as soon as possible, so if you have a trophy, can you please drop it in to the main office at the Carriageworks Theatre. Tickets are on sale priced £6, which will get you fed!

CARRIAGEWORKS 10TH ANNIVERSARY SHOW

Anita has been working on this and information has been sent out to societies to pass on to members. Please speak to your committees if you haven't had this information.

There is also a plan for storytelling project to happen around the 10 Year Anniversary. As part of the project, the theatre is keen that the artists who will be performing the storytelling would spend some time talking to Guild members about their experiences at Carriageworks, the transition from the Civic Theatre to the Carriageworks or even further back! This is still in the planning stage, and if it goes ahead, they would be looking to speak to Guild members during September. If you're interested, please let me know.
