

Hello, and a warm welcome to this performance of Goodnight Mister Tom, by Leeds Children's Theatre

As a society we are dedicated to the principle of quality and affordable children's entertainment. We are the oldest established Children's Theatre group in the UK, founded way back in 1935, who's prime aim according to the original constitution was ""to inculcate in children a love of the theatre, and to provide suitable entertainment for them, using players who are either children or adults, or both as may be necessary to the production." Although much has changed over the years our purpose and objectives remain steadfast today, some eighty-two years on.

Our activities were interrupted when war broke out in 1939 when, like William and the evacuees in Goodnight Mister Tom, Leeds children and teachers were evacuated out of the city and schools were closed. According to BBC Leeds archives "starting on the night of Friday 14 March, 1941, bombs rained down onto the city from about 40 German aircraft. ... Before the all-clear sounded at around 3am, bombs hit areas including the Town Hall, the city's museum and City Station. In all more than 70 people lost their lives during nine air raids on Leeds"

Eventually, in 1947, Leeds Children's Theatre managed to get going again, and because of a huge demand for tickets, we had to find a larger venue. It was finally decided to hire the Albert Hall, as the Civic Theatre then was. because it could accommodate more than 700 children.

The (Albert Hall) Leeds Civic Theatre became our 'home' for many years, up until the theatre closed in 2005 to make way for the building to be restored and converting into the Leeds City Museum. An eventual replacement for the original museum bombed during the war, it opened in September 2008. Leeds Children's Theatre was honoured to be the last society to perform on the stage of the Civic Theatre, with a performance of Peter Pan. When we transferred to the newly opened Carriageworks Theatre in 2005, again Leeds Children's Theatre was honoured to be the first society to perform on the new stage, with our November production of David Wood's "The Ideal Gnome Exhibition".

The society has won many awards over the years, and in 2016 we were delighted to be awarded the NODA President's Cup; awarded in recognition of the success and unique nature of Leeds Children's Theatre - we are the only society that has a membership aged 7 to 70+ that exists to produce plays for children. Our President, Mrs Judith Unwin, jointly received the award with us, in recognition of her work with Leeds Children's Theatre over the years. We are an intergenerational society and encourage families to take an active role, not necessarily on stage but behind the scenes as well. Leeds Children's Theatre doesn't employ any staff, and only exists due to the hard work and commitment put into our activities by members and friends, and of course by you and other members of the public who continually support our shows by coming to see them. Thank you.

Our core activities include the two plays we stage each year and our weekly Saturday Workshop sessions for, and facilitated by, our members. There is a very long waiting list for young people wishing to join us, and take part in our Saturday Workshops. Adults who join are asked to undertake a DBS check (facilitated on our behalf by NODA). We believe it's very important to encourage and provide an opportunity for all children to experience the feelings and emotions brought about from being involved in live theatre, as performers or members of an audience.

Leeds Children's Theatre has recently been accepted as part of the Family Arts Campaign, and we will strive to make your time with us is as enjoyable as possible.







